University of Wisconsin System Women's Studies Conference

October 13-14, 1989

The 14th annual University of Wisconsin System Women's Studies Conference will be held at UW-Parkside. The theme is "Unity in Diversity." In addition to a broad spectrum of panels, the conference will feature a keynote address titled "Getting Minority Women Out of the Margins: Initial Steps in Curriculum Integration," by Elizabeth Higginbotham of the Center for Research on Women at Memphis State University.

Conference Location

The University of Wisconsin-Parkside, which opened in 1969, is one of 13 degree-granting campuses of the UW System. The distinctive campus is located on 700 acres of natural woods and prairie between Kenosha and Racine. More than 5,000 students are enrolled in a variety of majors and programs leading to undergraduate or graduate degrees.

To reach the campus from I-94, take Kenosha Hwy. E east to Wood Road and proceed north to the Campus Outer Loop Road. Park in the Tallent Hall Parking Lot on the east side of Wood Road (see map). A campus shuttle bus will take conference participants from the lot to the Campus Union and back on Friday. Racine city busses also provide shuttle service from the lot. On Saturday, you may park in the Union Lot.

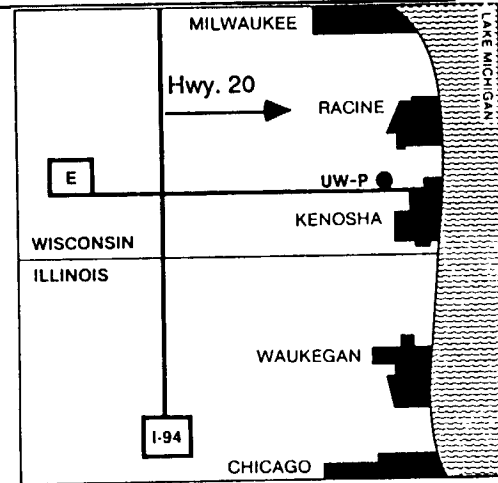
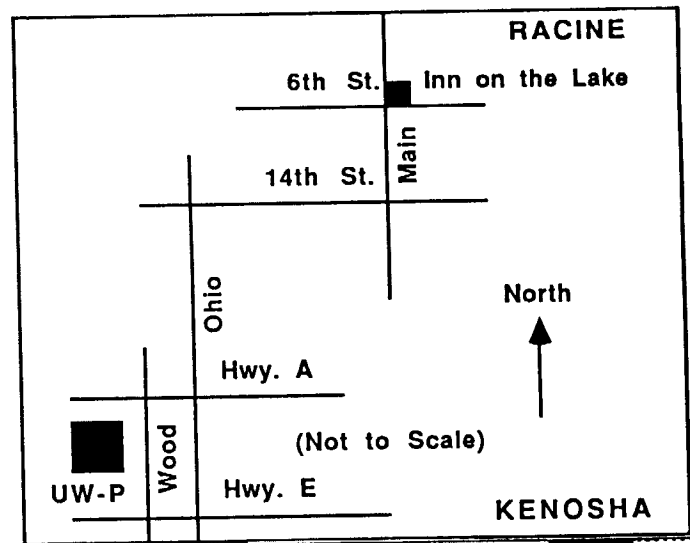
